The Thread offers opportunities for us to bike, hike, fish, paddle and simply reconnect with nature. The project is all about community. The Thread will be designed, built and owned by the counties, towns and citizens through which it is woven.

With technical resources and catalytic funding from The Thread, local communities plan and implement their portions of this green interstate system.
