



ROCKY CREEK TRAIL GREAT FALLS, SC

This trail is located along Rocky Creek, a tributary of the Catawba River. From the trailhead, walk approximately 100 yards to a t-intersection. One may then venture on a 1.4 mile roundtrip upstream or on a 1.0 mile roundtrip downstream.

The natural path, as well as the land surrounding it on both sides of the creek has been designated as an *Important Bird Area* by the *National Audubon Society*. This designation marks its significance as a diverse and healthy wildlife habitat.

Directions and Parking

From Great Falls travel approximately 1.2 miles south along Highway 21/200. The trailhead will be located before the Rocky Creek bridge on the left. Look for a dirt road entrance before the bridge.
