








Advisory Councils



- Before the Event...
 - Initial contact Public sign-up vs. Group
 - Confirmation/reminders
 - Communication with MCPRD staff
 - Planning and equipment/materials prep
- On-Site...
 - Sign-In with Liability Waiver
 - Welcome/Introductions, Safety talk, Q&A
 - Demonstrations as needed
 - Details, details...

Risk Management

Liability Waiver



WAIVER VERBIAGE

I and/or the volunteer group that I represent shall indemnify and hold harmless **Mecklenburg County**, its officers, employees and assigns from and against all claims, damages, losses or expenses arising out of participation as a volunteer. I understand that volunteer services to Mecklenburg County are to be completed without remuneration or monetary benefit of any kind. I also understand that volunteers are responsible for their own insurance (medical, automobile, liability or any other) and are not covered in any way through County Insurance. I also give my permission to use any photographs taken of me for marketing or other purposes.

DRY READING, BUT ESSENTIAL!!!

Risk Management

- Safety Rules:
 - NO power tools
 - Exceptions: string trimmer, backpack blower
 - ALWAYS inform Volunteers about essentials, and stick to them! Sturdy, closed-toe shoes; ear/eye protection; etc.
 - Age requirements -
 - General: At least 12; under 16 requires adult supervision
 - Trail construction: At least 16, under 18 requires adult supervision
 - Weather considerations "rain or shine" BUT...
 - When in doubt, STOP and ASK QUESTIONS!

Challenges

- SIZE of the Department!
- ONE Volunteer Coordinator
- Registration and tracking lack of software
- Maintaining partnerships
- Matching projects to groups or individuals
- Making new connections
- Volunteer retention
- Changes within Department



Successes

- Improved communication with MCPRD staff = more volunteer opportunities!
- Repeat volunteers AND new volunteers!
- By the numbers, for calendar year 2019 to date:
 - More than 6200 Volunteers
 - Over 40,500 hours
 - Value at \$25.43/hour = approximately \$1,029,915
